Northern Territory Government Honours 26 Filipino Professionals as the Philippines and Australia Mark 70 Years of Diplomatic Relations

29 July 2016 – The Northern Territory Government of the Commonwealth of Australia awarded 26 Filipino professionals with a Certificate of Recognition for their meritorious service in their own fields of expertise on 29 July 2016 at the Northern Territory Parliamentary House in Darwin. Hon Peter Styles MLA, Minister for Multicultural Affairs and Minister for Asian Engagements and Trade of the Northern Territory, led the awarding ceremony. Also present were family members of the honourees, Mr. Ken Davies, CEO of the Northern Territory Department of Education, Mr. Rod McGrath, Ministerial Adviser to Hon Peter Styles MLA, and Philippine Consul General to the Northern Territory Januario John Rivas, a.h.

The Northern Territory holds the earliest and longest recorded history of settlement of Filipino families dating back to 1860. The Filipino professionals awarded were part of the second wave of Filipino migrants who actively promoted their Filipino identity and served with commitment and dedication in their respective professions for 37 years or longer until the time of retirement.

In her message read by Philippine Consul General Rivas a.h., Philippine Ambassador to Australia Minda Calaguian-Cruz said the recognition honours their *“contributions to all facets of Australian society and for demonstrating the very best of Filipino culture – our ability to build strong and lasting connections with people around us no matter where we are in the world.”*

The awarding coincides with the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between the Philippines and Australia this year and celebrates the contributions of Filipinos to the development of a dynamic and vibrant Philippines-Australia partnership. END
